Convention Project is Hope Harbor Home

Eta State NC President Sheila Groves and the Planning Committee have announced Hope Harbor Home as the 2017 Convention Project. Hope Harbor Home is Brunswick County's only program offering around-the -clock response to victims of domestic violence and their children. Services include a fully staffed safe shelter and crisis hotline, support groups, victim advocacy, meals, clothing, and transportation. Hope Harbor also employs a Community Educator who conducts presentations in schools on issues such as bullying, dating violence, sexual harassment, self-esteem, and other topics aimed at promoting nonviolence among students and throughout the community. During their 30 years of operation, thousands of women and children have found safe shelter and received services through Hope Harbor Home.
