



Rising printing and mailing costs and declining DKG membership caused the board to find ways to cut costs. #### **Wellness Initiative**

Dr. Teresa H. Cowan, Eta Sate NC EEC Chair, reminds members of the importance of the Eta State Wellness Initiative, "Self-Care Wellness— Living a Balanced Life."

Nearly 15 million Americans—one in 10 adults—experience depression each year? Major depression affects your mood, mind, body, and behavior and about two-thirds of those impacted don't get the help they need.

Women experience twice the rate of depression as men, regardless of race or ethnic background. An estimated one woman in eight will contend with a major depression in her lifetime.
