

In March, our very own Michelle Hairston was honored by the Southeastern Region of the American Music Therapy Association (SER-AMTA) with a Lifetime Achievement Award. Her interest in the field began when she was an eighth grader—a devoted school band member and a Jolly Popper at a local nursing home. These interests, plus encouragement from her father, Dr. Olin Parker, and his colleague and former professor, Dr. E. Thayer Gaston, led her to her career path. Along the way, Dr. Richard M. Graham's "Of course you can, Michelle" provided a supportive refrain as she pursued her doctorate while teaching and beginning a family.

Before joining the faculty at East Carolina University in 1987, Michelle worked at the Hallett School, part of the Whitten Center. Her students' band won awards, and some of them travelled beyond their homes for the first time in their lives. She also taught with her mother at the middle school she attended. During her time at ECU, she was able to teach and continue her clinical work as well as travel both nationally and internationally to present



her research. She has not only served DKG as Delta Chapter President but has held several positions on the AMTA's executive board for 14 years. After a dedicated 42 year career in Music Therapy, Michelle is retired. She thanks her family, colleagues, and students for their support, and is enjoying the time to play with a community band and pass on her love of music to her grandchildren.

Marketing the 'Unknown' 2021 & Beyond – Transforming DKG Events

Planning events, like conferences and conventions, is quite complicated. While many aspects of the process can only be explained with more words than allowed in this space, DKG Internitional leaders provide as many details as possible in as many ways as possible to increase member understanding of the "how," "when," and "why" of decisions surrounding conference and convention planning.

surrounding conference and convention planning. Due to the uncertain nature of in-person events in a pandemic world, the 2021 conferences in July are being planned as in-person events with a virtual layer – or what is called a "hybrid" event. Such an event provides members with heoption to tattend in person, if possible or preferable, or to attend virtually, if necessary or prefered. Because registration fees for DRG events cover the cast of providing a venue, speakers, and any audiovisual (AV) necessary for production, both layers will require registration and payment of a fee. For an in-person event, the venue is the hotel and AV is relatively uncomplicated. For the virtual layer, the "venue" includes the platform and equipment needed to stream the event – a much more complicated and costly technology than the usual AV. Both layers will share the same knowlow tapkers. While expenses were absorbed by the Society in 2020, broadening future events will require registration fees.

Of course, it is possible that international leadership may determine at its May meeting that it is in the best interests of members to cancel the in-person layer and move to a completely virtual event. If 6, any person who has registered for the in-person event may transfer registration to the virtual event and receive a refund for any ticknet events purchased with registration.
